

Soitron's statement on further steps taken to clarify the situation regarding stationary technical devices used to detect road traffic violations.

Bratislava, August 10, 2026 – SOITRON, s.r.o. is fully cooperating in resolving the situation concerning stationary technical devices used to detect road traffic violations. Based on findings by the Ministry of Interior of the Slovak Republic, media reports, and its own review, Soitron has identified serious suspicions that the actual origin of the devices does not match the origin declared by the importer. At the request of the Ministry of Interior of the Slovak Republic, we are, as of today, dismantling the two installed technical devices. The company is also discontinuing any testing of the devices in question and, in cooperation with the Ministry, will arrange for replacement devices that meet the security standards of the Slovak Republic and the European Union.

We consider the security of data and the operation of the devices to be a key and critical matter throughout the entire duration of the project. Since the situation first arose, we have been providing the fullest possible cooperation in clarifying the suspicions concerning the origin of the devices and the handling of the detected data. We are likewise providing full cooperation to the National Security Authority and other relevant bodies.

We wish to reassure the public once again that the solution we supply has never compromised the security of the data being processed or the integrity of the public spaces protected by the solution.

Recap

SOITRON, s.r.o. is delivering to the Ministry of Interior of the Slovak Republic a project to update and expand the application and technical equipment of mobile field workstations for the National Vehicle Register ("NEV 25"). Part of the expanded solution is the Transaction Module information system, the acceptance of which forms part of the milestone for implementing the Automated System for Detecting Road Traffic Violations (ASOPPCP) under Slovakia's Recovery and Resilience Plan.

At the time the ASOPPCP project was being prepared, the procurement of technical devices had not been completed; Soitron did not submit a bid for this tender.

To verify the functionality of the system being built, our company provided the Ministry with two units of technical devices for testing purposes. The Ministry of Interior of the Slovak Republic commissioned verification of functionality using certified devices, which were supplied to it by Soitron in accordance with a specific technical specification and which Soitron had procured from a Slovak supplier. The devices were delivered with a valid certificate from the Slovak Institute of Metrology and deployed in a strictly isolated environment; they capture exclusively technical sensor data and passively transmit it to the designated system for further processing.



This made it possible to verify the functionality of the central system that had been built. The system's functionality remains intact following the dismantling of the test devices, and the system is ready for the connection of replacement certified devices.

Next steps

At the request of the Ministry of Interior of the Slovak Republic, SOITRON, s.r.o. is, as of today, dismantling the two currently installed technical devices. Our company is bearing the costs of both the dismantling and the replacement devices. At the same time, we will present the Ministry with an alternative solution that will meet the project's original objectives; its deployment will be subject to approval and security vetting by the state. We have discontinued testing of all devices owned by our company and have also dismantled the test device located at our headquarters on Plynárenská Street in Bratislava.

Through this step, we aim to help clarify the situation to the greatest extent possible while also helping ensure that this key milestone of Slovakia's Recovery and Resilience Plan is not jeopardized.

It remains Soitron's long-standing commitment to help the Ministry of Interior enhance public safety and strengthen citizens' trust in the work of the Police Force. The delivery of the Transaction Module information system supports this goal by improving road traffic safety, building on positive experience from other EU countries. We therefore believe that the efforts made by the Ministry of Interior and by us will serve the citizens of the Slovak Republic as originally intended.

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
